\*A maximum of three (3) 33-gallon bags of household trash may be disposed of per week without additional fees. Household trash is defined as standard items that are disposed of in an indoor, household trash receptacle on a regularly occurring basis. Typically, this refers to wastebaskets in the kitchen or bathroom, rather than a workshop or garage area where large projects are completed. Items such as carpeting, flooring, cabinetry, dry wall, toilets and lumber fall into the category of construction and demolition waste, as do other items involved with renovations, remodeling or large clean-up projects in a home or a garage. Items classified as construction and demolition waste, along with large, bulky items such as furniture, do incur a fee.
