



# Dunn County Recycling Guide

Confused as to what goes in the bin? Here's a quick rundown with an easy reference chart.



## Recyclable

### IN BOTTOM OF BIN



Number 1 & 2 plastic bottles such as detergent, milk, pop or vitamin bottles crushed with caps removed.

### TO BE BAGGED INDIVIDUALLY



Steel Cans    Aluminum Cans    Magazines    Glass Containers



Mixed paper including newspaper, phone books, office paper, paperbacks and mail may be all bagged together. No shredded paper.



Corrugated cardboard, shoe boxes and dry food boxes such as cereal and cracker boxes may be bagged together. Larger pieces of corrugated cardboard may be flattened and put under or alongside the bin.



## Take The Plunge!!



**General curbside recycling pointers:** Rinse and flatten whatever you can. Loose plastic bottles go on bottom of bin. Separate glass, cans etc... into individual paper bags and put in bin. Larger items that don't fit in the bin can be placed alongside or underneath the bin. No items contaminated by food (i.e. pizza boxes).

**If you don't already have a bin:** Check with your local hauler to see if they have recycling collection bins available. Local haulers can be found in the yellow pages under Rubbish. If a hauler does not provide collection bins, they can be purchased from 8 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. at the Dunn County Solid Waste Division, located at 390 Red Cedar Street, Suite C. Price of bin: \$8.00.
