

2019 Conservation Awareness Poster Contest



The theme for the 2019 National Association of Conservation District's Conservation Awareness Poster Contest was, "Life in the Soil: Dig Deeper". The Dunn County Land and Water Conservation Division sponsors the contest at the local level with members of the Dunn Environmental Education Steering Committee (DEESC) administering it.

This year's contest brought in 11 entries from Mrs. Halpin's 7th grade ELA Class at the Colfax Middle School and 31 entries from Mr. McMahon's Science Class at the Menomonie High School. The students were enthusiastic and did a wonderful job portraying the theme in their posters. In the 7th-9th grade level, Amy Wenzel took a first place at both the local and West Central Area level. These students represented the Colfax Middle School. The poster submitted by Jenna Blomquist, a Menomonie High School student, placed 1st at the local level in the 10th-12th grade level and went on to represent Dunn County at the West Central Area level. Ving Chang and Nicole Luoma placed 2nd and 3rd respectively at the local level. All 1st through 3rd place winners received Menomonie Chamber Bucks from the Dunn County Land and Water Conservation Division.
