

Dunn County Transit is maintaining services to support community needs. These needs include, but are not limited to, nutrition, medical appointments, banking and jobs.

The following routes are running as scheduled, Doorstop, Community and Red Cedar. Appointments for Volunteer Drivers are scheduled through Dunn County ADRC and this service will remain without changes. The Saturday Community Route will not be running from Saturday March 21 through Saturday April 19.

This week during Stout Spring Break, we are not operating the campus route. Next week, March 23 through March 27, 2020 the UW Stout Route has been adjusted to meet the returning student needs. This will be reevaluated as campus policies change.

Daily cleaning procedures include driver's use of hand sanitizer, and each driver is required to clean the interior of their assigned vehicle daily. This cleaning consist of using anti-viral, anti-bacteria wipes on hard surfaces. Anti-viral and anti-bacteria sprays are used to disinfect soft surfaces. All floors are swept and waste containers are emptied daily.

As part of the drivers' **Daily Pre- and Post-Trip Inspections** the drivers conduct preventive maintenance checks using an FTA Inspection Check Sheet. This inspection involves checking tire pressure, fluid levels, lights, brakes, doors, windows, mirrors, heaters, air conditioners, lifts, wipers and emergency on-board equipment. The inspection must be documented by the driver on the Inspection Check Sheet, which is then turned into management. Regular FTA inspections on all vehicles are performed by authorized inspectors bi-annually.
