



PERMIT PROVISIONS AND CONDITIONS OF ISSUANCE

Pursuant to Wisconsin Statutes and WCHA Utility Accommodation Policy, this permit is granted to allow performance of the specific work described herein. The following standard provisions and any included special provisions shall govern:

- 1) The Applicant agrees to indemnify and hold harmless the Permitting Authority, its employees from any cost, claim, suit, liability and or award which might come, be brought, or be assessed, because of the issuance or exercise of this permit, or because of any adverse effect upon any person or property which is attributed to the partially or entirely completed works of the Applicant. Accomplishment of the permitted work or any part thereof, by or on behalf of the Applicant shall bind such Applicant to abide by this permit and all its conditions and provisions.
- 2) The permitted facilities shall, if necessary, be altered at the expense of the Applicant to permit alteration, improvement, or maintenance of the highway as may hereafter be required. The entire cost of constructing and restoration of the permitted facilities shall be the obligation of the Applicant and the Applicants representatives of the permitted utility.
- 3) No open cutting for a crossing will be allowed that crosses under the roadway within the County Right-of-Way. All utilities will be installed via directional boring at a minimum depth specified by the Permitting Authority.
- 4) When working within the County Right-of-Way, traffic control devices are required for the installation of the permitted utility. All traffic control requirements will be adhered to per the Manual on Uniform Traffic Control Devices (MUTCD). If a lane closure is required, the Permitting Authority must be notified *72 hours* before the Applicant can proceed with the utility installation.
- 5) All disturbed areas during construction shall be returned to its original condition prior to the installation of the permitted utility. Upon completion of the installed utility, the Applicant and its representatives are responsible for all restoration of disturbed areas in a timely manner of *2 weeks*.
- 6) The Permitting Authority must be notified upon completion and reserves the right to inspect the installation, and restoration processes at any given time and reserves the right to deem any changes as necessary to satisfy the Permitting Authority and its representatives.
- 7) During the installation of the permitted utility, all access to private drives and public intersections shall not be restricted.
- 8) Any trenching, tunneling, or excavating shall be performed in accordance with the requirements of OSHA and the Wisconsin Department of Industry, Labor, and Human Relations, and any applicable local regulations.
- 9) A copy of the approved application, along with any plans and special provisions, shall be available on the jobsite.
- 10) An application fee is required before any above/below ground utility can be installed from the Applicant. (\$75 utility fee for the first 200 feet and \$55 for every 1000 feet of utility installed after that.)
- 11) Private Utilities (Irrigation, Manure Transfer, Water, Electric, Gas, Sewer, etc.) installed within the road right-of-way shall adhere to the same provisions as noted above, as well as any special provisions by the Permitting Authority.
 - 1) A utility permit application must be submitted along with a detailed plan and map showing all applicable details. The permit must be approved by the permitting authority before proceeding with the installation of the utility line.
 - 2) Private Utilities must be encased in a larger diameter pipe within the County right-of-way and buried at a minimum of 30" below the lowest point within the right-of-way. The pipe diameter and materials must be submitted and approved by the Permitting Authority before installation. All materials used must be installed in accordance with the manufactures recommendations.
 - 3) Private Utilities that "daylight" outside of the highway right-of-way or that parallel the road right-of-way must be installed at a minimum distance specified from the permitting authority. The permitting authority will determine the specified offset based on the existing right-of-way, and site specific requirements, which may vary from different roadway sections.
 - 4) A tracer wire must be installed with private utilities for future locating purposes. The applicant must become a member of Wisconsin Diggers Hotline for inclusion of the underground utilities in the state's location system per State Statute 182.0175.  - 5) The applicant must contact the permitting authority 24 hours in advance before installing the utility line so that a representative can inspect the installation process and that all permit provisions are adhered to when installing the proposed utility.
