Minutes of the Dunn County Criminal Justice Collaborating Council (CJCC) Data Work Group Meeting Held on August 18, 2020 via Zoom

1. **Call to Order:**
2. **Call of the Roll:**
 - a. Present were Chair, Katie Schalley; DHS Director Kris Korpela; Criminal Justice Assessor Sandy Frigo; Sherriff's Office Records Technician Hanna Neuberg; Menomonie Police Records Specialist Meghan Cartmill; Garrett Bunkleman Probation and Parole; Child Support Director Josie LaLiberty; and Criminal Justice Coordinator Sara Benedict with Website Specialist Krista Vind.
3. **Approval of the Minutes of the July 21, 2020 Meeting**
 - a. Correction to the July 21, 2020 minutes, adding Meghan Cartmill.
 - b. Meghan Cartmill made a motion to approve the minutes with correction, Records Technician Neuberg seconded the motion. No discussion. The motion was approved by voice vote.
4. **Staff Reports:**
 - a. The CJCC meeting was held last week, and Coordinator Benedict was able to present the 10-year data trends to that group.
 - b. Work groups are running again and will take a look at goals and objectives to see what still may get accomplished for the rest of the year.
5. **Center for Policing Equity**
 - a. This came from the EBDM workgroup. Chief Atkinson will bring in the Center for Policing Equity group to take part in data exploration with the MPD. He will reach out to other law enforcement agencies to see if they would also like to participate. The request to this work group is that we be able to support requests for information as needed. This is a group that will help with transparency for the law enforcement agencies. As Coordinator Benedict learns more about the time line and requests, she will bring it back to this group as needed.
 - b. Records Specialist Cartmill made mention that the Bureau of Statistics is putting out a website for people to see the different calls that come in.
6. **Monthly Dashboards- June and July, 2020**
 - a. June – The Average Daily Population started to increase again, after a period of time, during Covid, where the number of people in jail was reduced due to contagion concerns. However, the bookings are beginning to grow again. Proxies

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are on the low end, but this process is being reinforced by offering more training on the use of these proxies. Treatment Court and Family Treatment Court have seen some terminations as it has been difficult during Covid with limited access to treatment. The Assessment Protocol has not been performed in June and July but will start up again in August. The Reentry Program numbers are also stagnant for a period of time during Covid.

- b. July – Bookings are still at about half the normal number. The FTA rate is going back up again. The various numbers are still off due to Covid. Assessments are being done virtually, at this time. DHS Director Korpela pointed out that there seem to be a higher percentage of people being held in jail than the previous couple years. Records Specialist Cartmill mentioned that at this time, the law enforcement is only taking in more serious offenders and so, there are more being held this year from previous years.

7. OWI-Deeper Dive

- a. Due to some questions from the previous meeting, it was determined to review the 2019 data set further. These questions were related to the mapping, where, the time of day, correlation of time/age, correlation of age/BAC levels. In addition, OWI follow-up questions regarding passengers in the car. This data set will take longer to compile before ready to review. There is interest from the Executive group to continue to look into the OWI data as these offenses take up a lot of money and time.

8. Recidivism Project and Next Steps

- a. Coordinator Benedict shared the Google Docs document that various people in several departments are contributing information to compile on the treatment and diversion programs that CJCC runs. Reviewed some of the particulars for each program. These will be ongoing projects and to date are not yet completed with all the criteria from previous years. In addition, our data can be compared to the National benchmarks.
- b. Discussed next steps:
 - i. Data clean up. Cleaning up the data as the CCAP searches were not all up to date.
 - ii. Comparison Group. Once the graduates data is re-evaluated, will move on to the comparison group of those who were referred but never started.
