Chair Prochnow,

I would like to submit the motion below to be included at item 8a under section 8, Consideration for Actions To Be Taken By The Commission. This request to amend the agenda is for our Wednesday, September 9, 2020 transit meeting.

Looking at the calendar, understanding the potential sunset clause on the Governor's order, and thus having a potential gap between that sunset and our October meeting I thought it would be wise for the commission to review and consider my motion below.

### **Motion: Policy Regarding Face Coverings, Social Distancing, and Capacities on all Dunn County Transit Vehicles**

*Whereas*, Dunn County like the state, country and globe is engaged in an effort to mitigate and manage the COVID-19 pandemic to the best of its ability;

*Whereas*, simple and effective tools to fight the spread of COVID-19 include face coverings, social distancing, and proper hygiene as indicated by the World Health Organization, the US Center for Disease Control, the Wisconsin Department of Health Services and the Dunn County Public Health;

*Whereas*, public transit is subject to unique operational challenges during the pandemic;

*Whereas*, the Governor's Executive Order #82 has declared a public health emergency, and;

*Whereas*, the Governor's companion Emergency Order #1 requires the wearing of face coverings in all enclosed spaces;

*Whereas*, Dunn County Transit is currently operating all routes with the requirement of face covering and social distancing to remain compliant with the Governor's order;

*Whereas*, Dunn County Transit's number one goal is to maintain a healthy and safe environment for riders and drivers alike;

Whereas, the Governor's order is set to expire on September 28 and the possibility of an extension is unknown;

Whereas, the Federal Transit Authority and the Wisconsin Department of Transportation lists operational requirements of face coverings, six-foot distancing, and reduced capacities as best practices for all public transit operations;

Therefore be it resolved, that the Dunn County Transit Commission sets forth a policy of required face coverings for all riders and drivers, six-foot distancing, with properly reduced capacities on all Dunn County Transit routes;

Be it further resolved, that this policy will remain in effect until the Dunn County Public Health Department advises the Transit Commission that the policy is no longer needed.
